The Licensing Act 2003 came into force recently and will have a possible impact on many people, as all premises previously licensed for selling of alcohol, public music, entertainment etc will need to apply under the new laws. Gedling Borough Council is now the "licensing authority" for this parish, having taken over the duty. The Parish Council has already received several communications from residents in relation to the application submitted to Gedling Borough Council for extended hours at The Griffins Head.

The Borough Council have confirmed that the application is for:

Opening for the sale of alcohol between the hours of 08.00 and 12 midnight from Monday to Wednesday but closing at 01.00 in the morning.

Opening for the sale of alcohol between the hours of 08.00 and 01.00 from Thursday to Sunday but closing at 02.00 in the morning.

A licence for live and recorded music from 09.00 until 12.00 midnight Monday to Wednesday and until 01.00 in the morning from Thursday to Sunday.

Under 16 year olds to be allowed in the premises under the supervision of an adult.

Should any parishioner wish to comment on this application, or indeed for any other licensed premises within the parish or borough, they should contact The Licensing Officer, Gedling Borough Council, The Civic Centre, Arnot Hill Park, Arnold, Nottingham, NG5 6LU or by phone on 0115 901 3895.

Representations must be relevant to at least one of the following objectives: prevention of public nuisance, public safety, prevention of crime & disorder or protection of children.

Archaeological Days Update. About 80 people turned up for the recent Archaeological Days held on the playing field, reasonably successful considering the appalling weather on the Sunday. A lot of interesting information was available; the Parish council has been given some useful information to keep, including a decent aerial photo of the parish. An enjoyable barbeque was held for members of Friends and the archaeologists on the Saturday evening, well done Robin Barton for winning the skittles match!

A fair amount of careful digging on the “live excavation” revealed another 15 courses of stonework on the sluices near the wooden bridge where the tree roots have grown through the stonework over many years. The depth of this watercourse has led to a rethink on the way the balancing ponds were used, the way the water would have flowed, been stored and used. At the South end of the Wood more work is planned on the brick structure, thought to be a sump which carried water under Papplewick Lane, until further excavation can be undertaken safely due to the depth we will have to keep guessing it’s real purpose.

Playing Field has suffered yet more damage to the Astroturf this time due to mini motorbikes being misused on it. The police have taken action to stop this re-occurring. The council is obtaining quotes for the repair and will be seeking reimbursement of the costs of this and previous damage.
