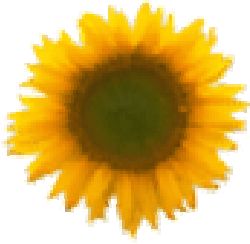
**Annual Church Summer Fete**    Will take place this year on Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> June at 2.00pm.

## Moor Pond Wood News.



This shows one of the Papplewick Trail “interpretation boards” that have been installed within the Moor Pond Wood site. They are situated by the Lay-by on Linby Lane and at the entrances to both Moor Road and Grange Cottage Wood. They show details of the route of the watercourses, some of the wildlife and plants to be found in the area. It is well worth a visit to gain more information about these sites.

Additionally, new notice boards have been provided nearby to let people know of Work Days. Meetings and other events

A tremendous amount of work has recently been carried out on the sluices near the footbridge and this area is now looking very smart, giving a much better idea of the way the water flowed and how it was controlled. At the bottom end of Moor Pond work has continued on the “plughole” that was excavated recently. It is now known following a camera survey that this is linked both to the main pond and to the one near Warp Mill, although we are still not able to be sure that there was a route across Papplewick Lane. Further examination of the blocked up parts of brickwork will no doubt reveal more facts about this unique structure. The irregular oval shape and unusual brickwork have certainly led to many different suggestions about its purpose, also some interesting reminiscences and boyhood memories of years ago! A new bridge has been provided in Dam Banks Wood to make crossing the river safer, thanks to Lee Scudder from Notts County Council & the Leen Valley Conservation Volunteers.

The next Friends meeting is 30<sup>th</sup> June, probably a visit to another site. See notice boards for details.

From Ravenshead Neighbourhood Watch: Some people are in the habit of paying milk bills by placing a cheque in the top of a milk bottle & leaving it outside their house. This could be inviting trouble as, should the cheque be stolen, although the monetary value could be small, the information released such as name, address, bank name, account number & sort code would be of great value to a thief. May be better to ask milkman to call for the cheque or better still send it direct to the dairy.

Gedling Borough Council is asking householders to take responsibility for their own waste, and pointing out householders' new responsibilities under changes to waste regulations, which came into force on 21st November 2005. Householders now have a 'duty of care' to ensure their rubbish is only passed to authorised Licensed Waste Carriers. The Council will take action including charging residents for removal of rubbish disposed of irresponsibly, serving 'fixed penalty' notices, or pursuing prosecution, which can lead to fines of up to £5,000.
