



### Bonfire and Fireworks



The annual Bonfire and Fireworks Display will be held on Friday, 7<sup>th</sup> November. Papplewick and Linby Parish

Councils, together with the Papplewick & Linby Leisure Enterprise Group will be hosting this annual event on the Playing Field.

Gates open at 6.30pm, the Bonfire will be lit around 7.00pm with fireworks to commence at 7.30pm. As usual, there will be plenty of food and drink available to purchase.



### Defibrillator

Following discussions with the Village Hall Management Committee, the Parish Council have decided to raise funds for the purchase of a fully automatic defibrillator. It is intended to mount the defibrillator outside the Village Hall so that it will be available to both Village Hall users and others in the event of an emergency. At its last meeting, councillors decided to approach Village Hall users

for contributions towards this project, which could potentially afford life-saving assistance should anyone experience cardiac difficulties. It is anticipated that around £2,000 will be needed to purchase the machine and a cabinet in which to house it.

### Flooding at Hall Lane-Main Street junction

Following numerous complaints by the Parish Council and local residents, the gullies along Walter's Hill were finally cleaned out at the beginning of August when main Street and Blidworth Way were closed. The County Council have promised to have the gullies cleaned out by their contractor on an 18 month cycle. We are now hopeful that flooding at the junction between Hall Lane and Main Street will be prevented but will continue to monitor the situation.

Gullies around the Devil's Elbow have also been emptied recently following representations by a parish councillor. However, we are aware of ongoing problems with the gully near Ward's Cottage on Main Street and those at the junction of Burntstump Hill with Ash Lane.

# Playing Field



The three Sensory Garden planters are now well-established and thriving rapidly.

We are grateful for the assistance we have received from Great Central Railway at Ruddington, who supplied the sleepers, and Symbol Signs, of Radford, Nottingham, for supplying us with various signs for the Playing Field.



Once again equipment on the Field is being vandalised. Fire damage has been caused to a seat on the shelter closest to the skate park and the Council has recently spent £75.88 replacing parts on other equipment. Had it not been for the kind assistance of Richard Hull in carrying out this repair work voluntarily, the Council would have faced a much higher bill to have this work done. 
## Census Data

## Finance



The Council's external auditors, Grant Thornton, have given our accounts for the 2013-14 financial year a clean bill of health.

The Council's Finance Committee will meet on Wednesday, 29<sup>th</sup> October to devise a provisional budget and precept for 2015-16. It will then be submitted to a meeting of the full Council in November for agreement.

## Best Kept Village Competition

The Parish Council were disappointed to learn that we were not progressing beyond the first stage of the competition. We do not know when the judges visited or who they were but the Council has taken issue with some of their findings. On the positive side, they stated that: "individual cottage gardens were very pleasant and some attractive planters." However, they

were not impressed by the condition of roadside verges and made reference to "problems coping with dust and dirt on verges and pavements," at the Crossroads.

The Parish Council arranged for the Lengthsman to undertake a number of tidying-up works around the Crossroads area prior to their inspection. The judges also felt that more effort was needed to deal with the phone box and bus shelter. When we find the phone box, we will, of course, have it attended to. In the meantime, if anyone knows of the phone box's whereabouts, please email the Clerk!

## Barracks Farm Wind Turbine



A lively debate took place at the Public Meeting held on 22<sup>nd</sup> June with many people taking the opportunity to either make their views known or hear the opinions of others. Following on from this meeting, the Parish Council lodged objections to the application with Gedling Borough Council. At the time of writing, this application is still pending consideration.

## Road Accident Statistics

Every three years the Parish Council obtains details of all road traffic accidents occurring within the parish that involve injuries to road users. We need to be able to determine if the accidents occurring are random and unpredictable events, as accidents usually are, or if any patterns arise from the data that might indicate a more serious problem. If accidents are occurring in 'clusters' then we can press for action to be taken to prevent them from occurring in the future.

During the period 1<sup>st</sup> April 2011 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2014, there were a total of 31 accidents on parish roads. Out of that number, the most significant concentration occurred at the Forest Lane/Mansfield Road junction where eight collisions took place, all but one involving 'slight' injuries. Three of these involved cars emerging from Forest Lane and colliding with vehicles travelling northbound along Mansfield Road.

During the period in question, two fatalities occurred at the same location on Forest Lane. Both were the subject of extensive enquiries to determine their cause and we are satisfied that in neither case did the road environment contribute towards these unfortunate events. Two other accidents, involving people visiting the scene of the first fatal accident, occurred on the day after, the only collisions involving pedestrians during the three year period.

At the Severn Mile House junction there was only one recorded accident, a significant reduction over previous periods. Excluding the junction with Papplewick Lane, Moor Road suffered only one incident, where an overtaking motorcyclist struck a car turning into a driveway. Three accidents are recorded at the Papplewick Lane junction, two being very minor, the third, involving three serious and 2 slight injuries occurred in wet conditions at 3.55am on a Saturday morning.

Perhaps the most surprising fact is that only one accident is recorded as taking place at the Crossroads. This involved a single motorcycle travelling from Moor Road into Main Street and losing control at 6.62am during rainy weather. Bearing in mind that some 16 million vehicles passed through this junction during the three years in question, this low accident record is remarkable. Indeed, over the last 10 years only eight injury accidents have taken place at the Crossroads despite some 55 million vehicles using it in that time.



## Moor Pond Wood

We congratulate the Friends of Moor Pond Wood on securing a £13,000 grant from WREN. WREN is a not-for-profit business that helps benefit the lives of people living close to landfill sites by awarding grants for community, conservation or heritage projects. The money will go towards resurfacing paths around the site.

The Friends wish to place on record their thanks to Cllr. Chris Barnfather who has made a £500 contribution towards their work from his Notts. County Council divisional fund.
